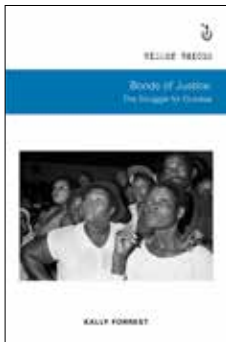


COMPETITION AND REGULATION FOR INCLUSIVE GROWTH IN SOUTHERN AFRICA

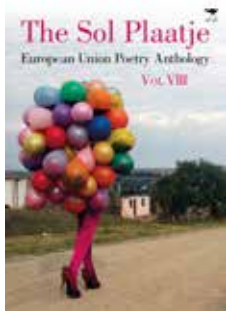
HIDDEN VOICES: THE STORY OF ONE TELLS THE STRUGGLE OF ALL

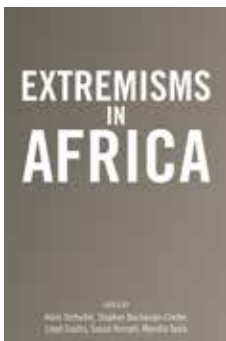
BUSINESS AS USUAL AFTER MARIKANA

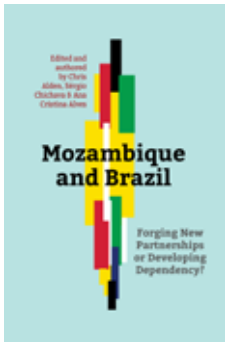
HIDDEN VOICES: FLASHES IN HER SOUL

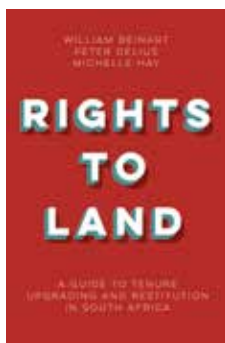
MOZAMBIQUE AND BRAZIL

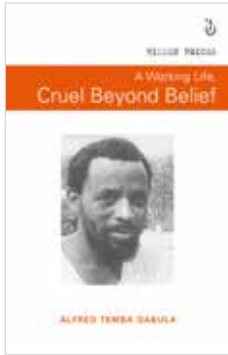


RIGHTS TO LAND

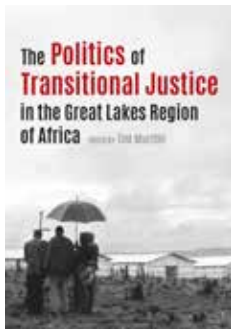


HIDDEN VOICES: A WORKING LIFE, CRUEL BEYOND BELIEF

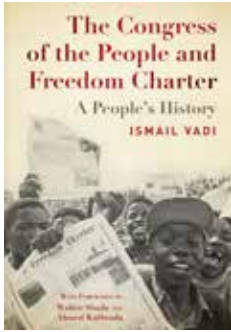


MOZAMBIQUE 1975/1985

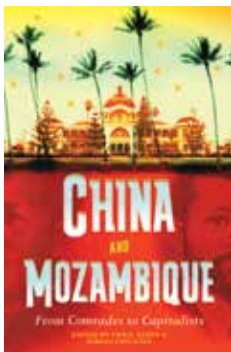

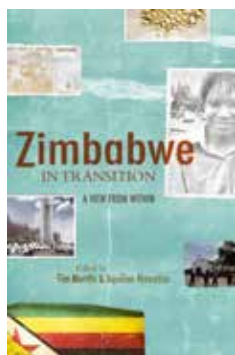
BLACK BULL, ANCESTORS AND ME

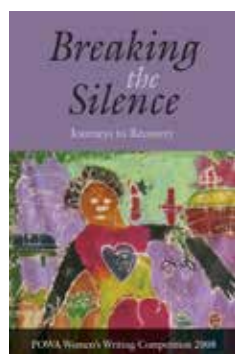

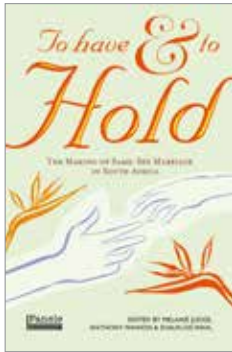

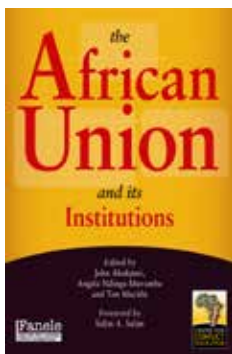
