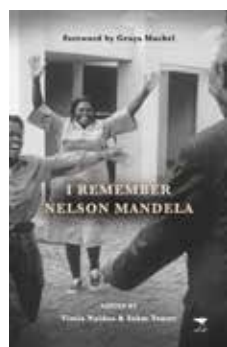


BIRDING IN SOUTH AFRICA'S NATIONAL PARKS
